






Braudel and Wallerstein, 1974





FIGURE 4.2 Three World-Systems Merged at Prestige-Goods and Information Networks








The Pivotal Year 1500




THE RESOURCE CURSE

THE PERIPHERY – CORE COMMODITY CHAIN

- Serf peasants, Slavs, cultivate fields with primitive tools
- Polish lord
- Jewish estate-manager
- German wholesalers in Baltic ports
- Swedish navy secures sea lanes
- Dutch global freight and entrepôt trade, banking

CORE: high profits, high taxes, skilled labor, technology, balance of elites, political tolerance, effective states

PERIPHERY: low profits, primitive technology, coercive labor controls (serfdom) — but fabulous elite consumption, low taxes, weak states



The first Russian modernization: *a-la Turca*

- New infantry (streltsy = janissaries) and the cavalry of state noblemen (pomeschiki = timariot)
- Bureaucracy (prikaz system = divan)
- Provinces (voevodstva = pashalik)
- Official church
- Toleration of conquered religious communities (= Ottoman millet)
- Elite control/promotion via terror (also Ottoman practice)









Witte, Stolypin, Durnovo**






